Cheyenne Plains Pipeline Project on Schedule to Begin Construction Mid-2004

Cheyenne Plains Pipeline Company, L.L.C. filed an application with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) for the Cheyenne Plains Project in May 2003. The project's initial proposal was amended on November 6, 2003 to 1) provide for the use of a 36-inch diameter pipeline, rather than the initially proposed 30-inch pipe and 2) reduce the total amount of compression to be installed at the Cheyenne Hub, after customer response during the open season indicated the need. Together, these changes maintain the original project capacity design of 560,000 Dth/d.



The Cheyenne Plains Project received preliminary approval from the FERC on October 22, 2003. Final approval from the FERC is expected in April 2004. To date, our company has ordered pipe for the project and construction contracts have been awarded, with pipeline construction expected to begin in mid-2004.

The Cheyenne Plains Project is scheduled to begin

service on or before January 1, 2005. The approximately 380-mile pipeline, which will extend from the Cheyenne hub southeasterly across Colorado and northwestern Kansas and end near Greensburg, Kansas, will provide a means of transporting the growing supply of Wyoming natural gas to markets in the mid-continent United States and to interconnects to markets further east.
